

INTEGRATED OCEAN GOVERNANCE IN KIRIBATI

In 2006, Kiribati established the Phoenix Island Protected Area, one of the Large Scale Marine Protected Areas in the world, which constitute around 11% of Kiribati's Exclusive Economic Zone (EEZ).

The Government of Kiribati further aims to scale up national efforts towards the creation of community and island based Marine Protected Areas throughout the country.

In 2017, the interim inter-ministerial ocean committee was formed, through the Ministry of Fisheries and Marine Resources Development and Ministry of Environment, Lands and Agricultural Development, to prepare for the United Nations Ocean Conference and discuss marine spatial planning efforts in Tarawa and Kiritimati Islands.

The members of this committee include technical experts from Government Ministries which includes:


This interim inter-ministerial ocean committee through leadership from Ministry of Fisheries and Marine Resources Development, sought cabinet approval to institutionalize ocean governance related committees within government, which include the national over-arching steering committee for the Kiribati's EEZ, its technical GIS support committee and relevant policy instruments required.

The Government is now moving into the direction of initiating marine spatial planning processes in Tarawa, Kiritimati Island and other Line Islands, as well as finalizing steps for institutionalizing functional ocean governance committees and policy instruments to oversee broad range of issues concerning EEZ of Kiribati.

2014 Discuss with government stakeholders on the Marine Spatial Planning process

2015 Existing area based management tools reviewed

2015 Follow up discussions on the Marine Spatial Planning (MSP) process with Kiribati Government

2015 Open Source GIS software training conducted

2015 Dissemination of over 100 open datasets on marine aspects and customized national maps for Kiribati shared with key Government stakeholders (Departments of Environment, Fisheries, Mineral, Lands and Phoenix Islands Protected Area)

2016 Marine ecosystems services valuation report finalized

2016 Marine Atlas introduced to Kiribati

2017 Dialogue among Government agencies on Ocean Governance, MSP and Voluntary Commitments before the United Nations Ocean Conference

2017 Government of Kiribati endorsed an atoll scale MSP to be formulated for Tarawa and Kiritimati Island

2017 First MSP workshop and GIS capacity training to key Government officials in Tarawa resulting in preliminary spatial maps and information as basis for MSP of Tarawa

2017 Cabinet memorandum on officiating the MSP process for Tarawa and Kiritimati Island drafted, submitted by the Ministry of Fisheries and approved by Cabinet

2017 Marine Ecosystem Services Valuation soft launched by Ministry of Environment and featured front page in the local newspaper 'Uekera'

2018 Scoping exercise for the initiation of Marine Spatial Planning process in Kiritimati Island
