ENVIRONMENT (PROTECTED SPECIES) REGULATIONS 2011

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by sections 41 and 86 of the *Environment Act 1999*, acting in accordance with the advice of the Cabinet, I hereby make the following regulations:

These regulations may be cited at the *Environment (Protected Species) Regulations 2011*.

2. Commencement

These regulations commence on the date that these regulations are published by exhibition at the Public Office of the Beretitenti.
